Tribute:

Juba Lee's Dakota Buckaroo, CDX, CGC – A K A "Arney"

MERIL SUESS RECENTLY LOST her longtime companion, Arney. We thought it only fitting to pay tribute to this unusual Ridgeback, who was such a wonderful ambassador of our breed.

Arney came into Meril's life about 12 1/2 years ago. Our daughter, Nicole, showed him in the conformation ring several times but he really didn't care for it, plus he'd bonded so deeply with Meril that he seemed so sad without her at his side. So, off he and

Meril went—to obedience school.

We all know how diligently Meril works with her dogs. She seems to get so much more out of them than anyone I know. And Arney didn't disappoint. He was one of the Top 10 obedience Ridgebacks in the country for several

years, and garnered #1 in 1994.

In addition to his obedience titles, Arney earned his CGC and consequently became a therapy dog for six or seven years. He had a weekly schedule of visiting two institutions: one for older patients,

Arney "sold" Ridgebacks wherever he went. Many people came to us and wanted a Ridgeback just like Arney!

He was unusual in many ways. He seemed to have no issues with anyone—happily sharing his bed with a resident cat and even a Bantam rooster after he tragically lost his hen. He happily accepted a new puppy, Spencer, and methodically taught him in the "Arney way."

We share Meril's loss, and hope that she can gain solace in Spencer, who appears to be following in Arney's paw prints.

General Meeting Minutes –March 11, 2004

Meeting was called to order for a general discussion at 8:25PM as quorum was not reached.

Board of Directors Present: Myrna Berger, Meredith Wisnieski, Barbara Rupert and Catherine Schock. **Absent:** Debra Driza, Debbie Drastrup, Mike Patterson, Lee Nudo and Linda Robbins. Ten club members were present.

First order of business: Minutes of the General Meeting of January 2004 were reviewed. A motion was made to tentatively accept the minutes as written by Barbara Rupert. The motion was seconded, and passed unanimously.

Corresponding Sectary: A memo from AKC has been received regarding future premium lists. New wording to include that exhibitors follow veterinarian's advice regarding health of dogs (i.e. proof of rabies).

A letter of introduction was received from artist Dan Sailor, an RR Fancier. Example of work was submitted for future reference.

Treasurer's Report: As of Feb. '04, checking was \$5142.69; savings \$2512.62; and CD at \$6342.08; for a total of \$13,997.39.

Reminders will be going out regarding membership dues. Leslie Walker moved to tentatively accept the report as given; it was seconded; and passed.

Committee Reports:

Specialty – The OCRRC Premium List is being reviewed and will be mailed out by March 17th. The flyer and Lure Coursing Premium list was mailed out on March 10, 2004. Catalogue ads will be due by March 26th.

It has been noted that the Grand Raffle Prize will be a custom quilt designed by Janet XXXXXX.

At this time John Shoemaker is the ring steward and an assistant steward will be obtained either by his choice or that of the club.

All committees are on top of their assignments, and all areas are covered by volunteers at this time. The trophies are solid lead crystal

with an African motif cut image.

It was noted that a pop-up shade will be needed for the "mentoring" area.

Lure Coursing — Dates were submitted for consideration by the club depending on other show and club activities. First choice was Oct 30/31 with a possible date in November as backup. August was ruled out because of the heat factor.

New Membership — Dan & Karen Carver of Santa Clarita have submitted their names for associate membership consideration.

Old Business:

Board of Director's Meeting Minutes – April 8, 2004

Meeting is called to order at 8:10 PM. All Board members are in attendance. The previous board minutes are approved unanimously. A motion is made and passed to approve the previous general meeting minutes as published in The Rambles.

Treasurer: See report on page 3 for account balances. Our CD is due to roll over. The next maturity date is July 6, 2004.

Specialty Report: The closing date was the 21st. Lou Guerrero said they'll give us a hospitality tent to put up by our ring. It'll be set up Wednesday so the SDRRC has the option of using it. If so, we'll split the cost. We need to post a note on RR-folk requesting people to donate water.

Discussion followed regarding the raffle. All the trophies are sold and being made (within budget), and will be done soon. Mike will get the trailer to the Specialty, but the it must find a new home! We also need to start thinking about a show chair for next year.

New Members: Associate memberships—Greg and Carrie Kryzys, from Temecula, sponsored by Mike Patterson; Skip and Patty Laurie, sponsored by Lee Nudo. Voting memberships—Linnea Post from Redlands, sponsored by Mike Patterson and Lisa Gutierrez; Tim and Patty Tennigkett from Silverado, sponsored by Catherine Schock and Janet LeClaniche.

These names will be approved at the next general meeting if there are no objections.

Old Business: We need to place an ad in the National Club's catalogs for OCRRC. Mike and Lisa Patterson volunteer.

Regarding the sweeps judge we voted on at the last meeting, Jenny Scattini is judging in 2005. The Sweeps ballot that went out was incorrect; it said it was for 2005 instead of 2006. We should accept the sweeps judges that were voted on for 2006, so Karen LaFleur will remain the 2006 Sweeps judge.

Lou Guerrero declined to be our regular judge for 2005, so Jay Hyman will be judging.

Jenny Scattini is also a licensed Jr. Showmanship judge. She could do that too unless Barbara Rupert already sent out Jay Hyman's contract. We'll have to check with Barbara. Mike Patterson makes a motion to have Jennifer Scattini judge the Jr. Showmanship category at the 2005 OCRRC Specialty in addition to Sweepstakes, unless it has already been assigned to the contract for Jay Hyman. Lee Nudo seconds; motion passed unanimously.

New Business: Supposedly, National Rescue has over \$130,000 in their account and RRCUS has no say in this. RRCUS has asked for a rescue committee to give them the profit/loss statement, which they haven't done. There's a discrepancy over the exact amount in the accounts right now. Discussion

followed. We'll wait until this information comes out before deciding whether or not to donate to rescue. Tabled until then.

It was then brought up that when we vote for judges, the ballots should be handled differently. It was suggested that ballots should come back inside sealed envelopes, inside an outer envelope, which is sent to the recording secretary. The recording secretary should then bring these envelopes to the next meeting, and they'll be opened and counted there. Discussion followed. Lee Nudo makes a motion to change the policy regarding how judges' ballots are handled and tallied for our Specialty. Mike Patterson seconds the motion. Motion carries unanimously.

We need to pick a fall match date and chairman. Lee Nudo volunteers as match chair. We prefer Irvine Park as the location.

We now need four dates: One for rattle-snake training, possibly August; one for agility fun day, possibly February; one for LC trial, the end of October; one for the match.

Discussion followed regarding donations. We'll ask for donation suggestions through *The Rambles*. A discussion followed about whether or not we can solicit votes from members who aren't present at meetings in order to achieve a quorum.

The next BOD meeting will be May 27.

A motion was made and carried to adjourn the meeting. Meeting adjourned at 9:50 PM.

"COME" is NOT a Four-Letter Word!

Part 1

In the Whelping Box...



But there are many Ridgebacks and their owners who think it is! The problem with the command "COME" is that it's often used when your RR is chasing after something he shouldn't be. It's *very* hard to overcome 4,000 years of that instinct to chase. So, while your RR may not come each and every time you call him, you *can* teach him to come 90% of the time. There are a few ground rules to follow in teaching a reliable COME [often referred to as "recall"].

First: *Never* call your dog to you in order to punish him. I cannot emphasize this enough. Why should your dog come to you if he thinks he's going to be punished? Would *you* come if you thought you might get scolded or worse? I don't think so! If your dog commits some major transgression, *you* go to the dog...*do not* call him to you to be punished! It's also a good idea not to call your RR to you to do something to him that he hates, such as giving him a bath, or trimming nails. Again, *you* go to the dog.

Second: Insist that when you give the command COME, your dog comes *every* time. It's one thing to call your dog casually to go to bed for the night or to go outside to relieve himself. *But* when you give the command COME, you need to insist that he comes, even if you have to physically bring the dog to the spot you were standing in: *do not* let him disobey the command.

Third: *Always* praise your dog for coming to you, especially if you have to physically make him come to where you are. Your RR should think that coming to you is the best thing in the world, and should always get lots of praise for doing so.

PLAY GAMES

It's easiest to teach your RR to come when he's a puppy. Puppies want to be with their humans; they look to you as their leader, and will naturally follow you. *Use this!* Make coming to you a game. This can work with adult dogs, too, if they're willing to play. Some adults will, some won't; it depends on the dog.

Catch me if you can: One game to play is "chase." You can do this in the house or in a fenced area. Run away from your RR, and call him as you run. "Puppy, come! Come, puppy! etc. Clap your hands, slap your thighs, do whatever you must to make your puppy follow you. Then stop, and when he gets to you, praise him lavishly. Tell him he's the best puppy in the whole world! Almost *all* puppies will play this game. In the house, you can also call the puppy in the same manner, and then hide. When he finds you, do the same thing—give him *lots* of praise. Give the command COME! with your voice rising at the end. You want your dog to think that COME! is a wonderful thing!

Puppy in the middle: For this, you'll need another family member, or a willing friend. Sit about six to 10 feet apart with your legs spread eagle. One of you holds the puppy and the other person calls him. As soon as the puppy goes to the other person and is praised and petted, the other person calls the puppy. Do this two or three times, but quit before the puppy gets tired (or bored) and loses interest.

With an adult you can modify the game a bit. Put two light lines (I use a clothes line) on your RR's collar. (At this point, use a regular buckle collar, not a training collar.) Each of you stand about 15 feet apart holding one of the light lines. Use a favorite dog treat, if necessary. Then, one of you call the dog and gently pull him toward you, if needed. If he puts up too much resistance and fights the line, walk up to him, *gently* take the collar and walk backwards to your original position taking him with you, while saying, "[dog's name] COME, good dog, COME! [dog's name]." When you get to your original spot, give him lots of praise and a treat. Then have the other person do the same thing. Do this twice, then quit. Continue playing COME games even as you advance to more formal training. It reinforces the command, and both you and your RR will have fun!

six feet. Say your dog's name and COME! as your dog gets to his feet, move backwards a couple of feet and stop. When your dog comes to you, do as before—give him *lots* of praise. Do this exercise a couple of times and end the session for the day. Play with your dog; give him a belly rub, whatever. You want him to enjoy these special times with you. If he doesn't understand what you want right away, that's okay, you can try again tomorrow, or the next day. He *will* respond, it just may take a while.
